Pilot Projects

• First-Year Seminar Experience (FYSE): FYSE 1101, FYSE 1102, and Faculty Learning
Communities: In Fall 2022 the FYSE 1101 predesigned course pilot will continue. As a reminder,
this course is designed to assist first-year students in acquiring and/or enhancing applicable
skills related to their academic and co-curricular goals. Students are guided through the
application of those skills using a variety of activities including reflection activities and the
completion of a signature assignment. In addition, FYSE 1102 will be piloted. This course is
designed to add additional opportunities for students to apply skills and engage in reflection. In
the fall the course will be offered in a predesigned 3 credit format with the option of using a
flexible credit hour format in subsequent semesters. The CELT - FYSE Course Design &
Instruction Learning Community will also be offered in the fall to guide participants in the
exploration of the design and instruction topics related to First-Year Seminar Experience (FYSE)
