# MLIS Advising Bulletin October 2022

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## PROCEDURE FOR REGISTRATION ADVISING

You are no longer required to contact your advisor to have your advising hold lifted for registration. Instead, complete the MLIS Advising Update Form at this link: <a href="https://valdosta.co1.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV">https://valdosta.co1.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV</a> aWq9WBcYqS1HZIi

If you are planning to continue to follow your approved program of study or are only making minor changes to electives or the order in which you're taking courses, then you probably do not need advising and are ready to register. If this is the case for you, select "No" for the survey question.

If you are making major changes to the order in which you are taking courses, are changing your area of interest/related electives, OR want to discuss course options with your advisor, select "Yes" and you will be contacted by your advisor. MLIS Advising begins October 24th and continues until you register.

Your advising flag will be lifted so you can register when registration opens. Please note this is not an automatic process and may take up to 24 hours to be completed.

Finally, if you are currently an MLIS 7000 student, you do not need to complete this form because you have already completed advising.

Remember, popular courses fill up fast, so please send in your advising form and register early!!

## **EARLY REGISTRATION FOR SPRING AND SUMMER 2023**

Early registration opens on Monday, October 31st, 7 am. Registration continues through early January with possible short interruptions (e.g., Banner closing for system updates). The *Registration Guide* is your source for important dates, resources, and instructions for registering in Banner.

## TAP (USG TUITION WAIVER) REGISTRATION DATES

Please also check with your employing university for any local policies you will need to follow.

- TAP registration for spring begins on November 15.
- TAP registration for summer begins on April 15.

## **USE THE BANNER WAITLISTS**

If a course you want is full when you register, please add yourself to the course's wait list. Remember, when you are on a wait list it's essential you check your VSU email at least once a day because if a seat opens the system will email you and you will then have a 24-hour period to register for the course before it's offered to the next person on the wait list. The waitlists are used to track how many additional students are interested in a course. Additional seats/sections may be added if there is enough demand to do so but not a guarantee.

## **Course Lists & Textbooks**

Look in Banner to find textbooks listed with courses or use the Bookstore online portal on the VSU webpages to find the textbooks and materials required for your courses.

## **Pre-Requisites & Co-Requisites**

To find out whether any of the courses you are considering has a pre-requisite, check the current Graduate Catalog ONLINE at: <a href="http://catalog.valdosta.edu/graduate/graduate-courses-instruction/mlis/">http://catalog.valdosta.edu/graduate/graduate-courses-instruction/mlis/</a>

If a course is a **co-requisite** for another course, you may take the two courses during the same semester (e.g., MLIS 7200 is a co-requisite for 7210, 7220, and 7230). If a course is a **pre-requisite**, you must take that course <u>prior</u> to registering for the course requiring it. The Banner system will not let you register for a course if you have not registered for or completed the required pre-requisite or co-requisite courses.

#### **Projected Course Lists**

If you want to plan when you will take courses in your program, there is a proposed MLIS course rotation schedule on the MLIS Academic Advising webpage. The MLIS courses rotate over a six semester (two-year) cycle. The website address is

## **Special Topics Courses for Summer 2023**

MLIS 7996 Trauma-Informed Librarianship 7-week course during Summer II term

Instructor: Dr. Debi Carruth

**Course Description:** As librarians, we engage with a diversity of patrons in a way rare for any other field. One moment we might help an affluent older woman navigate her granddaughter's online scrapbook and the next we might help a homeless young man who has struggled with addiction and schizophrenia to locate the tools he needs to secure stable employment.

One thing that both patrons might have in common is a history of trauma. In fact, whether you work in a public, academic, or special library, or a media center or other information organization, nearly all the people you encounter (patrons, co-workers, vendors, etc.) has at least some traumatic event in their history.

How can we know if someone is bringing trauma into their encounter with us? What can we do, both to keep ourselves safe and to ensure a positive, empowering experience for others?

This course will examine a broad overview of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and the general principles of Trauma-Informed Practice, and then apply this understanding toward building a culture of trauma-informed care in your own library.

# MLIS 7998 Genres for Adult Readers 7-week course during Summer II term Instructor: Dr. Colette Drouillard

Course Description: This course focuses on the examination and evaluation of materials for adult library users, with special attention to fiction genres; use of materials in programming; and emphasis on popular culture and adult literacy. This course is designed to teach students how to meet the popular reading needs of adult public library users. Genre fiction along with readers' advisory resources and tools are explored. Readers' advisory services including the interview, book lists, and book discussion groups are examined. Relevant research, trends and issues related to readers' advisory are discussed.

## **Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Examine, discuss, recommend, and write about a variety of genre fiction
- Provide readers' advisory services including interviewing, recommending, writing annotations and creating content/ subject focused book lists.
- Choose and evaluate readers' advisory tools and resources.

# **Existing Electives Added to the Summer 2023 Schedule**

**MLIS 7400 Collection Development** 

7-week course during Summer II term (same content as 16-week course)

Instructor: Dr. Xiaoai Ren

**Prerequisite or corequisite: MLIS 7000 or consent of instructor.** Principles and processes for building and maintaining library and information center collections. Identification, evaluation, selection, acquisition, and preservation of materials in all formats will be emphasized. The contexts of all types of libraries, needs of diverse patrons, and legal and ethical issues will be considered.

## **Call For Fieldwork Requests**

If you are nearing the end of your program of study and want to gain experience working in a library while you are still in school, contact your advisor about enrolling in MLIS 7960 *Supervised Fieldwork*, a 120-hour fieldwork placement that counts as a 3-credit course. Dr. Colson is accepting requests for fieldwork students for the spring semester. After you talk with your advisor, please email your request to <a href="mailto:lcolson@valdosta.edu">lcolson@valdosta.edu</a>, and let Dr. Colson know that you have permission from your advisor. Please submit your requests by Monday, Nov. 7th to have enough time to make your placement.

## What to include in your fieldwork request:

- Your request for a specific library or a particular library type.
- You may do fieldwork where you are employed, however you must follow the guidelines on how to structure these placements, for example, your fieldwork assignment must not duplicate any aspects of your current position.
- Include the names of a few relevant libraries located within commuting distance for you.

#### **Following your request:**

- Dr. Colson will contact the library to inquire about their ability to host a student for fieldwork and to confirm placement details. You may be asked to arrange an interview before a placement can be confirmed.
- You will receive a confirmation via email with information about your placement and further instructions.
- You will be manually registered for MLIS 7960 before the beginning of the spring semester.
- Please note: you will not be able to register yourself for MLIS 7960 as part of early registration. This can only be completed by Dr. Colson after all correspondence and placement agreements are in place.

#### GRADUATION APPLICATIONS

Planning on graduating in Spring or Summer 2023? If so, it is time to submit your Graduation Application. You will be routed to DocuSign to complete and sign your application for graduation, but you will NOT need to create a DocuSign account. The DocuSign portal will route your application for graduation to your advisor to sign.

Please also fill out the MLIS Curriculum Checklist and send it to your advisor at the same time as you submit the electronic application for graduation.
