Summer Core Courses Change to 11-Weeks

Starting this summer -2014 – core courses will run for 11 weeks. This is a change from the 7-week schedule. This decision was based upon the assessments now required in the core curriculum, and the time needed for students to do their best on all requirements.

How does this affect those of you considering summer classes? If you plan to take MLIS 7200, MLIS 7300, or MLIS 7800, those courses will begin Thursday, May 15, and end Thursday, July 31.

Other summer course options: You can still take a Maymester course, May 15-June 5.

There are a number of 7-week elective courses that begin June 11 and end July 31.

VSU's MLIS Program Earns Reaccreditation

This article is reprinted from a press release authored by VSU MLIS Assistant Program Director, Dr. Linda Most.

The ALA Committee on Accreditation granted continued accreditation status to the program at its Jan. 26 meeting. The next comprehensive review visit is scheduled for fall 2020.

The ALA first awarded accreditation to VSU's MLIS program in 2007.

"As the MLIS program enters its 13th year of operation," shared Dr. Linda R. Most, associate professor and assistant director of the program, "we remain committed to offering a quality publicly supported online education for generalists and specialists in the library and information science fields. The program's primary focus continues to be to educate librarians for academic, public, and special libraries in Georgia.

"The MLIS program faculty and leadership would like to thank the program's students, stakeholders, and our professional colleagues across the university and in the wider LIS community for their support, advice, and encouragement through the reaccreditation process. We couldn't have done it without you."

The ALA has awarded accreditation to 63 master's degree programs in library and information studies across the United States, Canada, and Puerto Rico, to date. The process involves an external review panel of practitioners and academics verifying that each program, including VSU's program, meets the standards for accreditation of master's programs in library and information studies.

GetEducated, a consumer group dedicated to helping students compare and rate United States-based online colleges and universities, named VSU's MLIS program a Best Buy in 2012. The program was found to offer a high quality education at a cost that ranks well below the national average.

Scholarship Opportunities

From the Georgia Library Association ...

The Georgia Library Association awards two scholarships annually to students completing a master's degree in library science. Recipients of both awards must agree to work for at least one year in Georgia following graduation. Applicants need not be residents of Georgia to apply.

The Hubbard Scholarship, a \$3,000 award, is intended to recruit excellent candidates for librarianship in Georgia and defray some of the costs of their education.

The Beard Scholarship, in the amount of \$1,000, is targeted for applicants of excellence who show strong potential for leadership in the library profession.

To be eligible, you must have completed at least 12 credits taken in the MLIS program at VSU by the end of this spring semester. You must have a GPA of 3.8 or higher

Arrange for a letter of support from a VSU MLIS faculty member to be sent to Dr. Koehler.

The theme for this year's ALA Conference is "Transforming Our Libraries, Ourselves." The conference runs from June 26-July 1. And it's in Las Vegas! And it features its usual all-star cast of authors, illustrators, library celebrities, and motivational speakers. The website has lots of information (http://ala14.ala.org/).

If you are planning to go to ALA, here are some tips for doing it in the most affordable way. Early bird registration for members ended March 3rd. If you missed that, register before June 20th to get the \$135 student rate. You must be a member to get this rate.

Register online at http://ala14.ala.org/rates. While you are registering, select your hotel – there is a link to do so.

The hotel rooms with conference rates are going fast. The cheapest one is The Quad with rooms as low as \$39 per night. A number of VSU faculty are staying at the Riviera – also affordable.

Warning!! If you register and try to reserve a hotel room at conference rates later, you will have to go back to your <u>online confir-</u><u>mation</u> and click the link to hotels which is way at the bottom of your email confirmation.
