Public Safety

The University Police Department has full authority to investigate any activity occurring on campus and take whatever action is required in emergency situations. Police officers are required to be certified as set forth by State of Georgia law and have all authority thereto associated. Additionally, police officers may seek assistance from local and state law enforcement officials through mutual aid agreements should the occasion arise.

1. Random Drug Screening.

Certified officers are subject to random drug screens as required by Board of Regents policy and State law. Refusal to submit to a drug test or testing positive for the use of illegal substances shall be considered grounds for dismissal.

2. Criminal Background Check.

Certified police officers and other positions defined by the institution are subject to criminal background checks prior to or subsequent to an offer of employment.
