The College of Education Assessment Committee met on October 21, 2003 at 2:00 p.m. in Room 264 of the Education Center.

The meeting was an overview meeting of the role of the committee and a planning meeting to discuss next steps. The charge to the committee was presented as, "To design, implement, and evaluate a non-systematically biased assessment system that documents candidate performance, candidate impact on student learning, and unit performance, and a system that informs program and unit development/revision."

Materials had been previously sent to members of the committee regarding NCATE/PSC requirements for unit and program assessment systems. These materials were reviewed and discussed in terms of the VSU College of Education current system. One of the requirements of the system is that it must be planned, implemented and evaluated in collaboration with community partners. Members were asked to submit names of community partners (P-12 teachers, curriculum directors, administrators, etc.) as well as faculty members in content areas in the College of Arts and Sciences for us to contact regarding their interest in serving on this committee. Suggestions were made by committee members to include personnel directors and parents of children in P-12 schools in our service region on the

committee. An additional suggestion was to ask the Arts and Sciences co-chairs of the discipline committees to serve on the committee.

Current program assessment matrices were distributed and members were asked to review and update the information contained on the matrix.

Pam Hertzog distributed materials and discussed regarding resources available through GSTEP (Georgia Systemic Teacher Education Program). She presented the BRIDGE rubric (draft) that identified indicators of accomplished teachers. The BRIDGE Rubric is aligned with BOR Principles, INTASC, Danielson, and NBPTS.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:00. Members were asked to review their program matrix and bring those revised matrices to the next meeting. The next meeting will be set after the community partner members are contacted and a mutually convenient time is established.
