



## Performance-Based Leadership Programs

The Department of Curriculum, Leadership, and Technology offers programs which lead to clear-renewable certification in performance-based leadership (PL). Students may enter in any semester and complete their programs in three (3) semesters. Courses are delivered in a variety of formats including online, weekend, and condensed summer sessions.

All performance-based leadership candidates must submit an assurance form from a local school system verifying candidates serve in leadership roles as defined by their local systems and supporting the performance-based residency requirements. Examples of these roles include, but are not limited to team leader, grade chair, department chair, SACS team chair, academic coach, school improvement team leader, athletic director, assistant principal, principal, curriculum coordinator, or special education director. Prior to enrolling in required course work, a candidate must meet the Georgia PSC pre-service requirement for performance-based leadership preparation (see information below)

### Specialist Degree (Ed.S.)---Performance-Based Leadership

***Offers candidates the opportunity to become certified in performance-based leadership at the building or system level (PL6) while developing leadership knowledge and skills specifically addressing their leadership roles and career goals.*** The program includes 12 hours of content knowledge and skills (at least 9 hours are taught online) and 18 hours of advanced performance-based work in your school or system.<sup>1</sup> For admission to the program the candidate must

- ✚ Hold a minimum of a master's degree from a regionally accredited institution.
- ✚ Meet Graduate School minimum score on MAT/GRE and GPA (see graduate catalog).
- ✚ Be employed in a leadership role as defined by the local system (see previous description) and submit a signed Superintendent's Assurance Form.

### Certification-Only Program---Performance-Based Leadership

***Offers candidates the opportunity to become certified in performance-based leadership at the building or system level (PL6 or PL7).*** The program requirements include 6 hours of specialist/doctoral level leadership coursework (previous graduate courses will be considered for transfer) and 18 hours of advanced performance-based work in your school or system. <sup>1</sup> For admission to the program the candidate must

- ✚ Hold a specialist or doctoral degree from an accredited college or university or a Level 6 or 7 Georgia PSC educators certificate.
- ✚ Be employed in a leadership role as defined by the local system (see previous description) and submit a signed Superintendent's Assurance Form.

### Pre-Service Educational Leadership Requirements

Prior to enrolling in required course work, a candidate must meet the Georgia PSC pre-service requirement for performance-based leadership preparation by holding a clear/renewable Leadership (L) certificate at the master's level or higher or meet one of the following criteria: hold a master's degree in Educational Leadership or complete LEAD 7420, Ethical and Legal Issues for Leadership, and LEAD 7020, Developing Leadership Capacity in Schools and Communities (approximate cost associated with the two pre-service courses is \$1600 based on fall, 2010 tuition and fees). Topics addressed in these courses include school law and ethics, organizational leadership, teaching and learning, and using data for school improvement. Prior graduate level course work will be evaluated to determine appropriate substitutions.
