
# Students Present at SRMC

### Honors Students Claim Top Honors: the Mack & Marga Awards

Honors students Ira Benjamin Collier IV and Katherine Wagnon were selected to receive the Mack and Marga Awards, distinguishing them as this year's outstanding students. Ira Benjamin Collier IV is a criminal justice major with a minor in aerospace studies. Ben is part of the ROTC program on campus; when he graduates on May 5th, he will be commissioned as a 2nd lieutenant in the United States Air Force. In June. Ben will be sent to Edwards AFB in California where he will begin training as a Special Agent in the Office of Special Investigations (OSI). There are only 300 total officers in OSI, and Ben was selected as one of twelve to enter the program this year!

Ben has received the AFROTC Cadet of the Year honor at both the university level and the state level.
