

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

During your visit, you will have the opportunity to discuss several scholarship opportunities offered by Valdosta State University. Based on the academic credentials that you already possess, you are a prime candidate for one or more of the following scholarships.

- **1 Azalea Scholarships \$2,000 per year** for students not residing in Reade Hall. This award is renewable for a total of \$8,000.
- 2 Reade Scholarships \$4,000 per year for students residing in Reade Hall. This award is renewable for a total of \$16,000.
- **3** Jennett Scholarships \$5,000 per year a competitive scholarship by invitation only. This award is renewable for a total of \$20,000.
- **4** Whitehead & Odum Scholarships \$1,000– \$1,500 per year. These are merit based awards which are renewable for \$4,000 \$10,000.
- 5 Steele Scholarships \$2,500. These awards are merit based and for students majoring in a field of study within the College of Business. They are renewable for \$10,000.
- 6 Departmental Scholarships amounts vary. If you qualify for a merit based scholarship, you will be notified once you have been accepted for admission to VSU. The scholarship deadline is April 1st. Departmental Scholarships may require an audition or other applications. You can apply for admission on line at www.valdosta.edu/admissions.
