Fraternity and Sorority Excellence

Valdosta State University January – December 2014

The Fraternity/Sorority Excellence Program is designed to highlight chapter achievements that promote the founding values of each organization and further the mission and vision of the Fraternity/Sorority Community at Valdosta State University. While success can be defined differently to each chapter member, leader, council and national organization, the impact that a chapter can have on its members, our campus and the surrounding community should not go unrecognized.

A well balanced fraternity/sorority experience should be provided to each member of our community on an annual basis. In order to provide such an experience, chapters should focus their efforts on programing/events/initiatives/participation and excellence in the following areas:

- Academic Success
- Leadership Development
- Member Education (New and Continuing)
- Brotherhood/Sisterhood
- Fraternal Relations (Collaboration with other fraternity/sorority chapters)
- Community Service
- Philanthropy
- Celebration of Ritual

Within our community there are men and women that have earned the distinction of 'leader'. It is important to acknowledge and celebrate that the extraordinary acts of select women and men on our campus help to advance their chapters and our community. Individual awards, sponsored by Greek Ambassadors and Order of Omega are outlined below. **Individual Award** applications are due no later than April 3, 2015.

Any chapter receiving of the possible 140/160 points or more will be invited to give a presentation to compete for "Chapter of the Year". The presentations shall be a maximum of 30 minutes each. No more than 10 chapter members may attend. No other parameters shall be set.

Eligibility: The packet of information submitted will reflect only the events/activities/data that occurred between January and December of a given year. All materials must reflect that time period. A participating chapter must be recognized as a registered student organization and in good standing with the Greek Life Office and their National Office in order to participate. Completed Excellence packets must be physically submitted to the Office of Student Life by 5:00pm on February 1, 2015 in order to be considered. No late exceptions will be granted.

<u>Guidelines for Disqualification:</u> Any packet submitted after the deadline will not be considered. Applications that include any false or misleading information will be disqualified from consideration.

Review and Selection: Select faculty/staff/students will review all chapter excellence packets and individual awards and award a point value for each category. Any person serving as a judge will not be allowed to issue a score for a chapter to which they are personally affiliated. Points will be totaled by the Assistant Director of Student Life and checked for accuracy by the Graduate Assistants for Student Life.

Guidelines for Submission:

- Award packets should be organized in a way that aligns with each award category.
- Clearly marked sections/categories should be separated.
- All materials should be able to fit within the following categories. Any combinations of the categories are allowed and encouraged.
 - o Three-ring binder including print materials
 - o Photographs
 - o Video footage limited to 15 minutes in length
 - O Physical display no large than a tri-fold display board
- The final submission should include a cover page with the following information:
 - Name of chapter
 - o Name of individual primarily responsible for compiling submission
 - Signature of chapter president certifying that all information contained within submission is accurate.
 - Signature of chapter advisor certifying that all information contained within submission is accurate.
 - o Total number of pages/items included in submission
 - o Date and time stamp (INTERNAL USE) of submission.
 - Self -evaluation conducted by chapter president for each category including but not limited to points anticipated to receive out of total possible points.

Chapter Excellence Categories

Academic Success

(20 possible points)

Chapter GPA for each semester falls into the following categories:

- High GPA- Top 1/3 of sororities/fraternities (5 points per semester)
- Median GPA- Between top 1/3 of fraternities/sororities and bottom 1/3 of fraternities/sororities (3 points per semester)
- Low GPA- Bottom 1/3 of sororities/fraternities (1 point per semester)

In a medium of your choice, please answer the following:

- Does your chapter recognize members for high or improved academic success? How?
- Does your chapter assist members who fail to meet academic standards? How?
- Does your chapter encourage members to make academic success a priority? How?

Leadership Development

(20 possible points)

In a medium of your choice, please answer the following: (15 points)

- How does your chapter's leadership incorporate your organizational values into their style of leading and in teaching leadership to younger members?
- How does your chapter's leadership promote/encourage accountability to your organizational values?
- How does your chapter leadership develop and implement new programs to keep the chapter constantly improving?
- How does the leadership of your chapter maintain active participation among chapter members?
- How does your chapter foster leadership in the VSU community outside of your organization?
- How does your chapter continue to develop members into leaders?

Chapter Leadership Recognition: (5 points)

Please include a letter/email from your National Office outlining any local, regional or national awards that your chapter or its members have been given.

Member Education (New and Continuing)

(20 possible points)

In a medium of your choice, please highlight the following:

- All educational programming for new and active members which includes the history/values/ritual of your organization.
- Methods of internal accountability for your chapter (i.e. standards, personnel, judicial, etc.)

- Method of chapter leaders to educate and promote understanding of chapter and university risk management policies.
- Officer transition program/training process.

Brotherhood/Sisterhood

(20 possible points)

In a medium of your choice, please highlight the following:

- Your chapter's brotherhood/sisterhood
- Any brotherhood/sisterhood programming or events that your chapter hosts
- Ways in which your membership incorporates new members into the brotherhood/sisterhood of the chapter

Fraternal Relations

(20 possible points)

Fraternal relations shall include collaboration with other fraternity/sorority chapters on our campus

In a medium of your choice, please highlight the following:

- Any collaborations/partnerships with chapter from a different council in events/programming/etc.
- Any programming your chapter hosts/co-hosts/attends with another fraternity/sorority on our campus.
- Ways in which your chapter and its members promote positive relations with chapter within your council.
- Ways in which your chapter and its members promote positive relations with chapters in other councils.

Community Service

(20 possible points)

Community Service Excellence shall be determined based on a combination of the time, energy and effort dedicated to a particular activity/ event.

In a medium of your choice, please highlight the following:

- Community Service opportunities your chapter provides its members
- Any campus-wide service projects in which your chapter has participated
- Any service your chapter provides to the community outside Valdosta State

Please include a print out from Campus Connect of your chapter totals for both the fall and spring semesters. Spring dates shall include service from January 1-June 30. Fall dates shall include service from July 1-December 31.

Philanthropy

(20 possible points)

Philanthropy Excellence shall be based on monetary or item donations.

In a medium of your choice, please highlight the following:

- The cause/purpose/organization of your chapter philanthropy
- The impact your chapter philanthropic efforts have had on the recipents
- In what ways your chapter participates in the philanthropies of other fraternities/sororities
- In what ways your chapter participates in campus-wide philanthropies

Celebration of Ritual

(20 possible points)

In a medium of your choice, please highlight the following:

- The values of your organization and how your members uphold them
- Ways in which your chapter reflects upon your Ritual outside of ceremonies (i.e. workshops, continuing education, debriefing with new members following initiation, etc.)
- Ways in which your organizational values contribute to the betterment of our VSU Fraternity/Sorority Community as a whole
