LSAMP Trivia: Did you know?


In 1991, the first **6** alliances were funded by the National Science Foundation. These original alliances are referred to as, "The Grand AMPs". Today, the Program has grown to **55** alliances across **565** institutions of higher education.



The LSAMP Program is named after the late, Honorable, **Louis Stokes**, (February 23, 1925 – August 18, 2015) Democratic United States House of Representative from Ohio. Stokes began practicing law in Cleveland in 1953. Stokes argued the seminal "stop and frisk" case of *Terry v. Ohio* before the United States Supreme Court in 1968. In 1991, the National Science Foundation renamed the "Alliances for Minority Participation" to the "Louis Stokes Alliances for Minority Participation" as a tribute to Congressman Stokes, a champion of access to education for all. The LSAMP Program has grown to support nearly 25K students PER YEAR since 1991.

In addition, the LSAMP Program has supported more than **650,000 STEM students** from African-American, Hispanic American, Native American, Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian and Native Pacific Island Students since its inception.




